



Teacher Institute Hawai'i 2012: Ways to Expand Your Curriculum and Resources

Teacher Workshop for Grades K-6

June 21-24, 2012

Location: Haleakalā National Park, Maui

Teachers completing this workshop will have a better understanding of what resources are available to facilitate them in implementing lesson plans that are relevant to Hawai'i. These resources include programs like Aloha 'Āina, Navigating Change, and Project Learning Tree. Participants will also have the opportunity to be outside connecting with the environment and explore ways in which these experiences can be translated into lesson plans.
